**MISSISSIPPI GOES DRY.**

Exciting Scene Occurs in the Legis-  
lative Hall—Many Women Present.

Jackson, Miss.—The passage of the  
statutory prohibition law by the house  
Friday was no surprise to anybody, but  
it was never supposed that it would  
pass unanimously.

An effort was made by some of the  
more rabid prohibition members to  
change the date of closing the saloons  
from December 31, as had been agreed  
to by Bishop Galloway and other lead-  
ers and the whisky men, but it was  
voted down. The idea was to close on  
the 1st of June, but the committee  
had settled on the last day of the year,  
and that date stood.

Seldom is such a scene witnessed in  
a legislative hall. Prominent prohibi-  
tionists from all over the state were  
present. The galleries were filled to  
overflowing with ladies, many of them  
workers in the prohibition cause for  
scores of years, and shouts of "Amen"  
were heard in every direction when
